



Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant Program

Program Description

 Provides funding to support local initiatives to prevent death and serious injury on roads and streets.

Eligible Activities

- Development of a comprehensive safety action plan.
- Conducting planning, design, and development activities for projects and strategies identified in a comprehensive safety action plan.
- Implementing such projects and strategies.

Closing Date

• July 10, 2023

Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost Saving Transportation (PROTECT)

Program Description

 Support planning, resilience improvements, community resilience and evacuation routes, and at-risk coastal infrastructure.

Eligible Activities

Highway, transit, and certain port projects are eligible.

Closing Date

August 18, 2023
