Chairman Mayor Wise asked Mr. Berry if he wanted to speak. Mr. Berry explained that a previous task for a sub-area study of Johnson City is being done in-house by Johnson City staff, so we are proposing to partner with TDOT to update the Regional Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) Architecture and Deployment Plan. This ITS Plan is required to make certain projects eligible for funding, such as cameras on buses, fiber optics for traffic signals, etc. He displayed the new task page and said that the MTPO will be providing federal funds from the PL balance to pay for the plan and TDOT will provide the 20% match.

Mayor Wells made a motion for the board to approve a resolution to amend the Fiscal Years 2020-2021 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) to replace Task E with a new task to update the Regional Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) Architecture and Deployment Plan in partnership with TDOT and move the funding to Fiscal Year 2021. Mr. Berry displayed the new capital project page for NET Trans to accept Federal Transit Administration Section 5339 funds to purchase a vehicle to provide service within the Johnson City Urbanized Area, but outside of the Johnson City Transit service area.

Agenda Item 7: Chairman Mayor Wise stated the last item on the agenda is Other Business and the first part is an update from MTPO Staff.

Mr. Berry announced that the state made an award to conduct a study on the Boones Creek Road Corridor, which is State Route 354. He also announced that the MTPO staff will begin the process of updating the Metropolitan Transportation Plan, or the Long Range Transportation Plan this summer. The first step is to update the Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan, or the Coordinated Plan for short. He also stated that the Census Bureau has released the first set of data from the 2020 Census, which was the congressional apportionment data. Some large states lost a seat in Congress while some states gained seats. More data counts will be released later this fall.

Ms. Pamela Kordenbrock introduced herself as the director of the Tennessee Division of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). She announced that two previous grants, the BUILD and TIGER grants, have been merged into a new program called the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) grant. For this round of RAISE grants, the maximum grant award is \$25 million, and no more than \$100 million can be awarded to a single State, as specified in the appropriations act. Up to \$30 million will be awarded to planning grants, including at least \$10 million to Areas of Persistent Poverty. Mr. Matt Meservy with TDOT also spoke and stated that Governor Lee should make an announcement today about whether or not he will extend the Executive Order for future government meetings.

Resolution 2021-08: Consider approval of adopting the Fiscal Years 2022-2023 Unified Planning Work Program

The Johnson City MTPO staff has finalized the Fiscal Years (FYs) 2022-2023 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for Executive Board approval. The UPWP outlines tasks to be undertaken by the Johnson City MTPO, along with identifying funding sources to complete these tasks. The two-year UPWP covers the federal fiscal year starting on October 1, 2021 and ending on September 30, 2023.

The UPWP covers five traditional tasks that are included every year. Three major documents will be updated over the next two years. The update to the 2017 version of the Coordinated Public Transit – Human Services Transportation Plan, which will begin this month, will be completed by the spring of 2022. Also, the update to the 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) will start this fall, with a completion deadline of February 2023. A new 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program will also be drafted next year, to be adopted by the end of calendar year 2022.

The draft UPWP was submitted to the Tennessee Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration, and Federal Transit Administration for their review and comment. During this review process, comments on the draft were provided to the MTPO from these agencies and satisfactorily addressed.

WHEREAS, the staff of the Johnson City MTPO, Tennessee Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration have reviewed the Fiscal Years 2022-2023 UPWP and found it satisfies federal requirements; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Johnson City MTPO Executive Board does hereby approve and adopt the Fiscal Years 2022-2023 UPWP.
